Please Help Support LISA Academy and the Student Council Make Some Children Smile for Christmas.

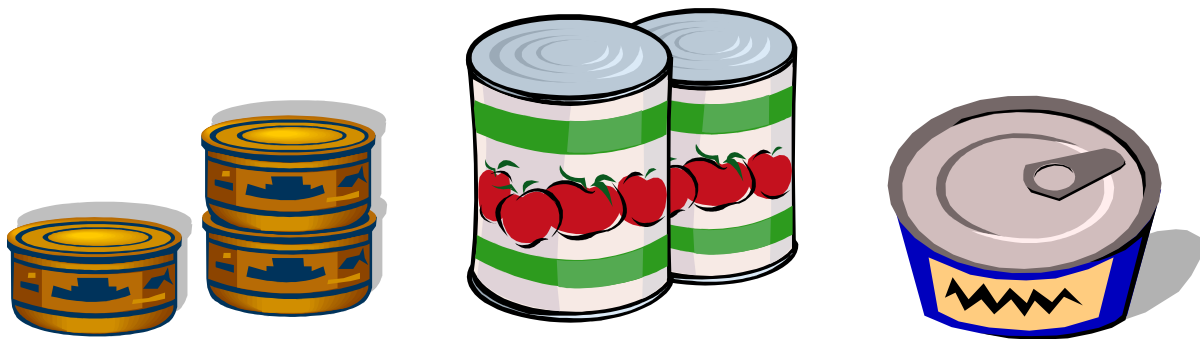
